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Reviews

"I will admit to having been skeptical when learning of this transcription, having known, analyzed and loved the string sextet original of *Verklarte Nacht*. But as happens in carefully done, well-conceived fine transcriptions, this one is remarkably successful (as it is far-reaching) in presenting a piece established in one setting satisfyingly and convincingly in 'new clothes.' Next was an arrangement by the Spring Wind Quintet's own Marsha Schweitzer of Mozart's A minor Piano Sonata K. 310, for a most unusual quartet of oboe, English horn, bassoon, and (get this!) contrabassoon.

I have to admit being skeptical at first. After all, Mozart's K. 310 was one of the most emotionally raw works he ever composed, exposing heart-wrenching dissonances, driven, pounding rhythms, and almost violent clashes, emotions that were usually tempered by Classicism's elegant facade.

Instead, I was intrigued by the different perspective Schweitzer's arrangement offered.

Played by winds, the piece is lighter, more legato and seemingly more consonant. I heard the piece in a new way, with new insights, which is precisely the point of arrangements. For example, the tempo of the second movement, with its long opening anacrusis, is usually determined by the piano's rate of decay. On piano, and especially on the fortepiano for which the piece written, one can only play so slowly before the line disintegrates. Played by winds, however, the struggle to maintain legato is resolved, leaving the choice of tempo to the musicians. Fascinating. — Ruth Bingham, *Honolulu Advertiser*

A few years ago, my quintet was called to play for a wedding, but most of the group was out of town. There were, however, a few string players around, so this quintet combination of strings and winds was created to fill the bill. Much of the music in the compilations below was requested by the bride of that wedding, and I thank her for so "commissioning" some of my favorite arrangements! These works are very versatile, as a flute or clarinet can be substituted for the oboe, or the strings can have these all to themselves by substituting a violin for the oboe and a cello for the bassoon.



Spring Wind: A Song for Kenji (1987)

Allen Trubitt (1931-2008)

Fair Winds - Gentle Winds - Wind in the Mountains - Gusty Winds



Allen Trubitt was Professor of Composition at the University of Hawai'i from 1964 to 1994. Spring Wind was written for the Spring Wind Quintet and dedicated to Kenji Otani (1923-1986), a clarinetist in the Royal Hawaiian Band

and Honolulu Symphony, and also Allen's composition student. The second movement is in klezmer style, and there are touches of inspiration from the quintets of Nielsen and Hindemith.

Five By Five (1998)

Neil McKay (1924-2016)

Waltz - March - Dance - Lullaby - Caprice



Canadian-American composer Neil McKay was Dr. Trubitt's colleague on the UH composition faculty, serving in that capacity from 1965 to 1987. *Five By Five* is a charming collection of five short, picturesque movements, adapted and expanded for the Spring Wind Quintet by the composer from one of his earlier piano works. Neil started out as an arranger of jazz and popu-

lar songs, but easily moved into other genre, and was often inspired by the music of Hawai'i, Asia, and the Pacific.

Movements for Wind Quintet (1993)

Angel Peña (1921-2014)

Prelude - Fugue - Allegro



A celebrated Filipino-American composer and bassist in the Honolulu Symphony, Angel was first known in the Philippines as a jazz musician. Like Neil McKay, Angel gained fame as an arranger in jazz and popular idioms and then moved seamlessly into "serious" music. These three movements use classical forms to display Angel's impeccable 20th century serial style.

Variations On A Simple Tune (1998)

Marsha Schweitzer (1949 -)



Like Angel Peña, Marsha is mostly known as an arranger. *Variations On A Simple Tune*, her only original work, is really a set of six arrangements based on a tune she wrote for a college music theory class. Each variation demonstrates a compositional device such as pointillism, 12-tone, fauxbourdon, and fugue.

The Spring Wind Quintet's 2021 release Na Makani

O Hawaii is a beautiful collection of repertoire and performances. The overall focus of this album results in a very personal listen, one that is at times beautiful, quirky, character-laden, and full of wonder.

Allen Trubitt's three-movement Spring Wind opens the album with much mystery and intrigue. The music is hauntingly gorgeous as it takes the listener down many different turns and trails. Schweitzer's "simple tune" is a gorgeous choral performed with supreme richness from the quintet. It is extremely triadic, and the quintet's intonation is impressive.

The entire album is wonderful and I encourage readers to take the modest thirty-eight minutes it will take to listen to the whole thing. The Spring Wind Quintet has shared very deep, expressive performances of music originating from artists in their own locale, and this album should serve as a model for the kind of art that can be achieved when artists so beautifully reflect their community.

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

Paka'a Lanakila! Spring Wind Quintet



Cleveland and Honolulu: A Cultural Travelogue (1994-95) Marsha Schweitzer 7.00

Cleveland and Honolulu is an account of the social, economic, cultural and philanthropic qualities of two distinctive American cities. The emphasis is on arts and culture, and how these cities demonstrate both the problems and the solutions to be found in America's nonprofit arts. Budgets of thirty arts, cultural, and educational institutions in both cities are included. The statistics are now outdated, but the principles remain the same.



Songs of Lili'uokalani Galliard String Quartet 15.00

The Hawaiian royals are famous not only as political leaders but also as musicians. Four in particular—Queen Lydia Lili'uokalani, King David Kalakaua, Princess Miriam Likelike, and Prince William Leleiohoku—were known as excellent composers, as such dubbed "Na Lani Eha," the heavenly four.

Queen Lili'uokalani was the last reigning monarch of Hawai'i. She was deposed against the wishes of the Hawaiian people by a group of American businessmen in 1893. Some of the Queen's best-known songs were written while she was under house arrest in 'Iolani Palace after the overthrow. (In 1993, President Bill Clinton signed Public Law 103-150, also known as the Apology Resolution, acknowledging the American role in the overthrow of the Hawaiian monarchy.)

The Galliard String Quartet brought the Queen's songs to new life in 1995 with this CD, which has become an oft-heard part of the Hawaiian music scene.

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
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
